

Marlen Textiles

According to REACH guidelines as of February 4, 2026 all Marlen Textiles finished fabrics would be considered an “article” which has a different set of compliance rules. There are two areas that must be considered. First, since we are an article, we would only need to register substances in articles, if these substances are released during normal and reasonable foreseeable conditions of use and the total amount of substance present in the articles with intended release exceeds 1 tonne per year. Second, we must identify SVHC (substances of very high concern); if there are any SVHC present in the articles above 0.1% (w/w) Marlen Textiles is obliged to inform recipients of the article with the chemical name and how to safely use the article. Further notification would be required to the ECHA (European Chemical Agency) if a SVHC present in the article has a concentration above 0.1% (w/w) and total amount exceeds 1 tonne per year.

Therefore, according to these guidelines all Marlen Textiles finished fabrics would be REACH compliant.
